Born May 5, 1934, she was the daughter of the late Munsey Gordon Overstreet Sr. and Myrtice Folmar Overstreet and the widow of George Truett Loudermilk. Mrs. Loudermilk was a graduate of Sydney Lanier High School in Montgomery, AL and Bowling Green Business University of Bowling Green, KY. During her life, Mrs. Loudermilk worked as a church secretary at Dexter United Methodist Church, Montgomery, AL, as a US Census enumerator for many censuses, as a bookkeeper, a substitute teacher for over 30 years in Moore and Coffee counties, and a "Demo Lady" at several stores around middle TN. As a resident of Tullahoma, she volunteered for several groups, including many years with the American Red Cross and Dossett Chapel. A woman of deep faith, she was a member of First United Methodist Church in Tullahoma for over 57 years where she was active in various church organizations and activities. Mrs. Loudermilk loved sewing, crochet, piano, singing and Tai Chi. She had a talent for turning strangers in to her friends. In addition to her parents and husband, Mrs. Loudermilk was preceded in death by two brothers, Munsey Gordon "Bobby" Overstreet, Jr. and William Earl Overstreet and one grandchild, B. Scott Colburn

Mrs. Loudermilk is survived by her daughter, Heidi Colburn (Larry) of Brunswick, GA, her son, Jon Loudermilk (Nancy) of Mt. *I am so sorry I missed the visitation and funeral. I didn't find out about them until well after the fact.*

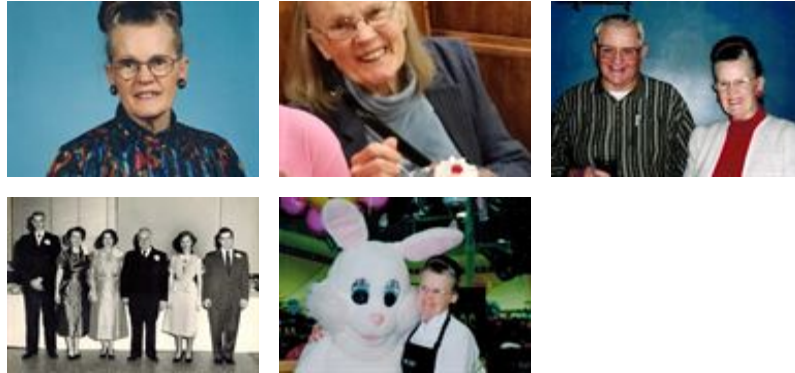
*She was a wonderful lady and will be dearly missed.*
