Charles Joe Rogers passed away in Nashville, Tennessee, on September 20, 2025,

proud to have reached the age of 90.

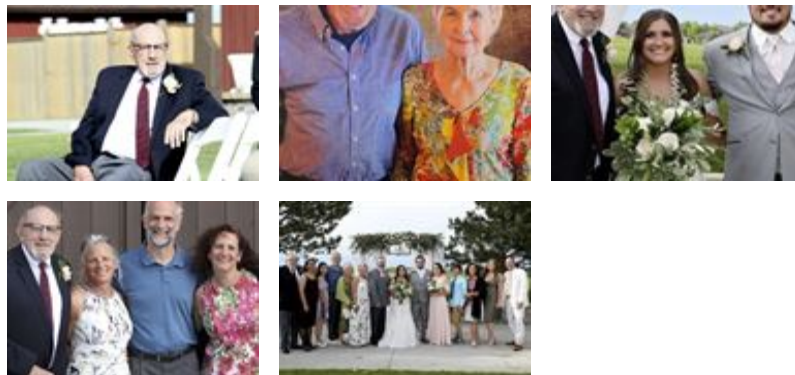
