Paul Max Quandt, Jr., 81, of Winchester and Shelbyville, passed away Tuesday, October 28, 2025, surrounded by family at home.

Max was born July 23, 1944, in Manchester, Tennessee, to Paul Max Quandt, Sr. and Nelle Shasteen Quandt. Max was a graduate of Franklin County High School, Class of 1962, and attended Tennessee Tech majoring in agriculture. He was preceded in death by his parents and son Paul Max Quandt, III.

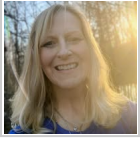
