Roy N. Eckert of Normandy Tennessee passed from this life on Monday, June 2, 2025, at Vanderbilt Harton Hospital in Tullahoma, Tennessee at the age of 77 years.

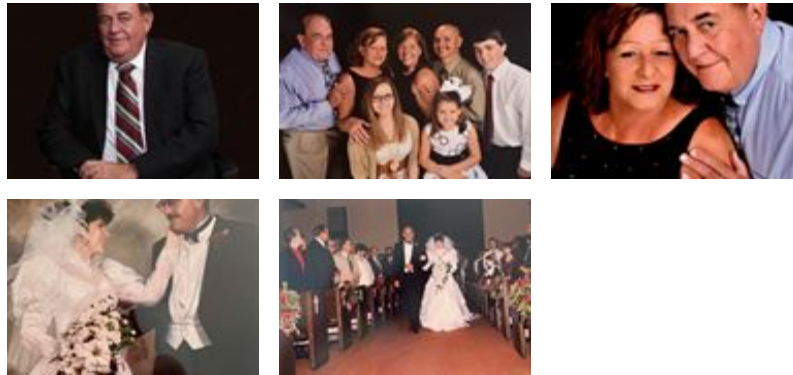
